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Plan Status

- West Dock Activities – *Marine Mammal Monitoring and Mitigation Plan* (bowhead whales, ringed/bearded seals, polar bears, walrus, other marine mammals as applicable).
- Marine Terminal and Mainline Activities – *Marine Mammal Monitoring and Mitigation Plan* (Cook Inlet beluga whales and other marine mammals).
